Factor	Impact	Statistic
Economic Cost	Annual loss to the economy	\$2.2 trillion
Employment	Unemployment rate among young adults	50% are functionally illiterate
Healthcare Costs	Increased medical expenses	Higher for those with low literacy levels
Incarceration Centers	Juvenile offenders with literacy issues	85% functionally illiterate
Poverty	Adults with low literacy living in poverty	43% of low literacy adults

4. Impact of Literacy on Refugees and Immigrants

- Educational Empowerment: Many refugees arrive with limited formal education, making literacy programs essential for their success.
- Evidence: Studies show that children from illiterate families struggle more in school and take longer to reach proficiency in English.
- Economic Mobility:

(a) Literacy and English proficiency significantly improve job prospects.
(b) Refugees who advance their education in the U.S. have better employment opportunities,

(c) Literacy reduces reliance on public assistance.

• Social Inclusion:

- Literacy enables refugees to engage with their communities,

- Literacy enhances understanding their rights, and participating in civic life.

Benefits for Americans and Society

• Economic Contributions: Refugees and asylum seekers contribute billions to the U.S. economy through taxes, entrepreneurship, and consumer spending.

• Between 2005 and 2019, they generated a net fiscal benefit of \$123.8 billion.

• Workforce Growth : Many refugees fill essential jobs, particularly in healthcare, construction, and service industries, helping to address labor shortages.

• Community Revitalization: Refugees often settle in areas with declining populations, bringing new businesses and cultural diversity that strengthen I ocal economies.

6. How to Volunteer

• No Prior Teaching Experience

Needed: Volunteers receive orientation to become effective tutors.

• Commitment: Tutors typically work two hours per week with students.

• Other Roles: Volunteers can assist with administrative tasks, fundraising, and outreach.

7. Impact Stories

• Success Stories: Many learners have gone on to secure jobs, earn promotions, and even become U.S. citizens.

• Personal Growth: Some Learners reiterated that the Literacy program helped feel more confident in her job and inspired them to pursue nursing, medicine and business creation
